Issue: What are the current and ideal roles, responsibilities, relationships and resources of Offices of Inspectors General, including but not limited to agencies that have a law enforcement function?

Scope: Evaluate Offices of Inspectors General, including but not limited to agencies that have a law enforcement function, and make recommendations to the Law Enforcement Consolidation Task Force.

Team Goals:

Objective 1: Provide information to the Law Enforcement Consolidation Task Force concerning the current Inspector General functions, specifically within agencies that have a law enforcement function.

Objective 2: Recommend a model Office of Inspector General organizational structure that effectively and efficiently meets current statutory requirements and describes the ideal role, responsibilities, relationships, workload, and resources for Offices of Inspectors General, including but not limited to agencies that have a law enforcement function.

Objective 3: Recommend the proportion and type of inspector general resources that should be attributed to state agency law enforcement functions.

Objective 4: Recommend a strategy for implementing Objective 2.

Work Product:

White paper(s) will be prepared that details the inspector general function, specifically within agencies that house a law enforcement function. This will include staffing, workload, and a summary of the Inspector General investigative function. Also identified will be issues associated with law enforcement offices and recommendations, including resources, for state agencies that have a law enforcement function.

White paper(s) will also evaluate the Inspector General function within state agencies and make recommendations, up to and including statutory changes to the Inspector General Act (20.055, Florida Statutes).

Timeframe for Completion: The initial work product(s) will be submitted by October 31, 2011. Final work product(s) will be completed no later than June 30, 2012.
