- If you get into a crash, #StayAtTheSceneFL! Not only is it the law, but it can ensure that those involved in the crash get the help they need.
- Did you know that there were more than 105,000 hit and run crashes in Florida in 2019? Staying at the scene could save a life! #StayAtTheSceneFL
- Leaving the scene of a crash is a crime. Don't risk significant fines or jail time - #StayAtTheSceneFL.
- After a crash, stay calm and #StayAtTheSceneFL – it's the most important thing a driver can do when involved in a crash.
- Drivers **MUST** stay at the scene of a crash and wait for law enforcement, especially if there are injuries or major property damage. #StayAtTheSceneFL
- If your crash is minor, no injuries or damage, you can exchange information and file a police report online. #StayAtTheSceneFL
- When you leave the scene of a crash, you could be leaving someone who needs critical medical attention. Save a life - #StayAtTheSceneFL
